

AMV nursing director & assistant chief name patient room

We are not special,” John Johnson says of his and his wife Sue’s decision to make a major gift to name a patient room at Ave Maria Village. “We are just giving back to something we really believe in.”

His wife Sue agrees: “This was just the right thing to do.”

Sue is intimately familiar with daily life at AMV. As the director of nursing, she understands how important it is that residents have their privacy in a private room. “I know how much easier it is for staff to work with someone in a private room,” she notes.

Sue and John both have stressful jobs. After working with Mayer Trucking, the Jamestown Police Department and Burlington Northern, he rejoined the police force in 1982 and has risen through the ranks to his present position as Jamestown’s assistant police chief.

Their gift of \$10,000 marks the seventh patient room to be sponsored by Ave Maria supporters. Sue also gives to the Hour Club, through which staff members contribute an hour’s pay per month or whatever they can to the facility’s fund-raising initiatives.

“This is definitely more than just a job,” she says. “Ave Maria Village is a good place to work. Everyone gives quality care, and I truly believe in the Sisters’ mission.

“The residents and staff are all like family — we really care about each other.”

John is a native of Connecticut. He spent four years in the military, stationed in Germany as an air traffic controller. He came to Jamestown to visit a buddy in 1976 ... and never left.

Sue graduated from Jamestown College. She joined Ave Maria in 1995, starting out as a floor nurse. She was named director of nursing in 2003.

The Johnsons met through mutual friends and married on Dec. 6, 1980. They have two children. Jessica and her husband Matt live in Dickinson, where she’s a department manager at Herberger’s. Son Nicholas lives in Fargo and works in the oil fields of western North Dakota.

The Johnsons love to relax from their stressful

jobs with time at home. Sue reads, and John (she says) “putzes around” their sanctuary with an endless list of do-it-yourself projects.

One such project is the little dog they rescued last December, so matted that it didn’t even look like a dog. They had just lost two much-loved canines and were up for the challenge.

“We didn’t know whether it was male or female,” Sue says. “Cleaning it up was like unwrapping a Christmas present.” The pup, whom they named Emma, turned out to be a sweet little Shih Tzu-poodle mix who loves to be touched.

But patience is a virtue ... and we can see signs of progress.

One example: Installation of all the personal, direct phone lines in residents' rooms. They're coming along. They are going to love the privacy and freedom when the new system comes online — and at no charge to them. The project is taking longer than we'd anticipated, but it's moving forward.

Then there are the new bath suites, which require state approval. Our experts have made changes requested by the state and resubmitted the plans; we await their approval. Then actual construction can begin.

And, despite the delay, there's good news: We now have the money in hand to take on not just one, but both bath suites as soon as we get the okay.

Now we're turning our attention to remodeling Ave Maria's kitchen – still just as it was when it was originally built 55 years ago. That's the next area in which your donations will make the difference. Kitchens have changed a lot in more than half a century; our current model has no counter space, and that just doesn't cut it. Angie and her staff also need modern, new appliances. They're looking forward to finally having the opportunity to cook up more homemade dishes, along with baked goods.

Our faithful volunteers are raising money for two dessert carts and two snack carts. What's the difference? Dessert cards are much shorter; that

means that whoever is pushing can see over them and avoid collisions. The carts will be used to deliver goodies to the satellite kitchens each morning and evening.

The snack carts will be equipped with reusable hard plastic coffee mugs and glasses – another step to eliminating Styrofoam waste. The lids are biodegradable and have “sip spots” so coffee drinkers are less likely to burn themselves on the hot brew.

The volunteers' goal is to raise \$4,595 for all four carts. They've made great progress by raffling off a quilt by Jill Bredahl that garnered \$670!

Next comes their dessert social on July 27 and our third annual Ave Maria Family & Friends Community Fun Walk on Aug. 5. If you ride, don't forget the Motorcycle Run Aug. 27. I'm rounding up door prizes for the Fun Walk and silent-auction items for the motorcycle run. If you'd like to help out, let me know.

I am also happy to report that we've now received gifts to name seven of the private rooms that will occupy our new addition. Who wants to be next? You can leave a legacy or honor or memorialize someone you love with your \$10,000 contribution.

Charlie & Marge Kourajian: 'We love everything about living here!'

When Charlie Kourajian started dropping his cards, at first the rest of his pinochle club kidded him about it. "Someone joked, 'Maybe we should play on the floor, since your cards are always there,'" he remembers.

But it became clear that his fingers were going numb at the card table. He brought it up to his doctor on a follow-up visit keeping tabs on his previous prostate cancer.

"Apparently I was having mini strokes or a light stroke," he remembers. The clinic called an ambulance that took him straight to Jamestown Regional Medical Center. After a battery of tests, physicians recommended a stay in a nursing home where he could be monitored, and — after a brief stay in another facility — he arrived at Ave Maria last December. Three months later, now back on his feet, he and his wife Marge moved into assisted living at the Heritage Center, where they've lived ever since.

"I can't say enough about the people who cared for me at Ave Maria," says the former Jamestown mayor, who served from 1997 to 2006. "I'd heard about the good care, but until you experience it yourself, you really don't know.

"I was going to ask Tim (CEO Tim Burchill) if he sent everybody to charm school before they started. Everyone has a smile on their face!

"I was pretty self-sufficient, but I did need help with a few things. If I needed something, all I had to do was push the button." He adds, "The nursing students from the University of Jamestown were very nice, too."

A gregarious, outgoing man, Charlie enjoyed Ave Maria's busy calendar of activities — "so many I had to choose. I couldn't go to all of them," he says. He particularly loved the Men's Club and attending Happy Hour. He visited with friends new and old over coffee every morning in the cafe. He's a big fan of the food, too, especially the soups — potato chowder, bean and ham, and knoephla.

When he and Marge decided to move into the Heritage Centre, they first spent six weeks on the assisted living facility's waiting list. "We're pretty self-sufficient here, too, but it's like an insurance policy. If we do need help, someone is there almost instantly."

Charlie and Marge were married in 1993, after both had lost their first spouses. Between them, they have three sons and three daughters, plus 14 grandchildren and four great-grandchildren. He worked for almost 50 years as a printer for the Jamestown Sun, then several as a car salesman at Don Wilhelm, Inc., and bus driver for James River Transport. He'd spent many years on the city council when he was elected mayor in 1997. He was also a long-time ambassador for the Downtown Association.

The Kourajians are very active in the Ave Maria Village/Heritage Centre community. They attend Mass and other services in the chapel, and especially like the opportunities to get out and about ... from trips to keep appointments to Marge's recent excursion to the casino with five other women. "And nobody lost anything! We got it all back," she reports.

Charlie is a member of the Welcoming Ministry at both Ave Maria and the Heritage Centre. Deacon Ken Votava provides him with the names of new residents. He visits them to make them feel at home, answers questions and responds to their concerns. He's made lasting friends and still returns to Ave Maria to have morning coffee with them.

Based on their own experience, Charlie and Marge have a word of advice for their peers: "If you are retired and need some assistance, get your name on the list at the Heritage Centre," he recommends. "We had to wait six weeks. It's a popular place."

He quotes an old sergeant from his military days. "He used to say, 'If you want to make the food line go down, the best way is to get into it.'"

"So take his advice, and get your names on the list for the Heritage Centre."

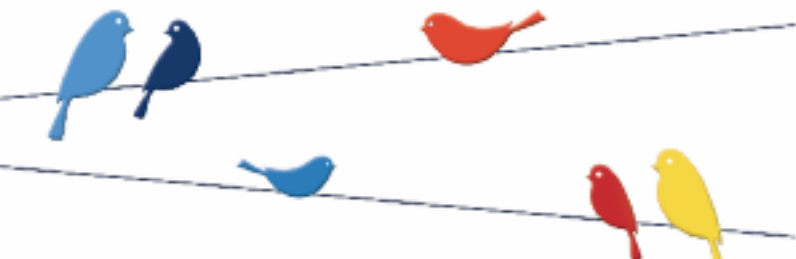
